ABOUT CONFERENCE

Contemporary India: Prospects, Challenges and Responses

Contemporary India has witnessed rapid transformation in almost all walks of life, particularly in last three decades. This transformation is the outcome of combined impact of economic liberalisation, globalisation, modernisation and information-technology revolution. As a result our economy and society have been developing at a faster page.

India is the world's sixth-largest economy by nominal GDP and the third-largest by purchasing power parity (PPP). The long-term growth prospective of the Indian economy is positive due to its young population, corresponding low dependency ratio, healthy savings and investment rates, and increasing integration into the global economy.

India's economic growth in coming decades has a huge potential if we properly utilize our natural and human resources. But there are many issues which need to be seriously deliberated upon in this Conference.

At present there are around 31 million unemployed in India. This number is going to increase as every year millions of youth after completing their education will enter the job market. It is estimated that by 2050 around 90 crore people are going to live in urban areas. How to provide for such large population without adversely affecting our environment.

In India, we observe that an economy of rich metro cities is surging and poor villages are decaying. Hence, there is an immediate need to reduce the gap between these two areas.

Crimes against women, child-abuse and neglect of our senior citizens are the issues of great social concern. India's National Crime Record Bureau reported 338,954 crimes against women, including 38,947 rapes in 2016. In India, a child is sexually abused every 15 minutes, according to the latest government figures. Numbers of oldage homes are rising in India, despite the tradition of joint-family.

Today, our country is riddled with a number of environmental concerns which have only aggravated in the last few decades. It is high time we tackle these issues head on as turning a blind eye is no solution.

There are many other concerns like the role of media, growing impact of social media, widening gap between rich and poor, which are supposed to draw the attention of our scholars. It is expected that two days deliberations on these pertinent issues will definitely bring to the fore relevant conclusions, which may be of great use for our policy makers.
